Florida Education Technology (FETC) Conference Report

Editor's Note: *The IBMSFQCCAA donated \$1000 to Don Estridge High Tech Middle School to send several teachers to the Future of Education Technology Conference (FETC) in Miami. This is a report from one of the teachers.*

How are you tracking student progress? What differentiation strategies are you using? Are you monitoring 100% of your students? Teachers are asked these questions consistently to make sure that equity and access remain at the forefront of the priority charts in classrooms. Under the Marzano method for teacher evaluations, using formative assessments to track progress is listed as a condition for learning. Upon receiving my invitation to FETC, this was an area that I, as a new teacher, felt I could use a little “tune-up.”

As a technology teacher, with a paperless classroom, I was instantly drawn to the title on the FETC schedule “Using technology for the formative

assessment in the classroom.” After attending the class, I was able to put together a Google slideshow for my peers to preview a range of options from low level technology like Plickers that allows the teacher to scan printed puzzle pieces for correct answers, to higher level technology like the Google add-on Pear Deck which incorporates assessment strategies into Google slides.

Another great experience was a visit to the All In Learning booth to participate in a challenge. The All In Learning program streamlines Florida standards into the software and compiles data to show areas of improvement, while increasing classroom engagement through a quick game, which students love!

While waiting for my next class, I had the incredible opportunity to chat with Alefiya Master, Female Founder and CEO of MAD-learn. MAD-learn infuses computer science in all content areas by allowing students to create and

develop their own mobile apps. It is so cool! My admittance to FETC was a huge boost to my motivation in my classroom, as well as my motivation to help other teachers at Don Estridge efficiently track data, create an engaging classroom, and increase scores by using technology for their formative assessments. Patti and I are both active in our church and have been involved in leading Bible studies in a church mission that is in one of the challenging communities in Pittsburgh. Shortly after arriving in the Pittsburgh area in 2009, I teamed up with another person to start the first men's Bible Study Fellowship (BSF) group in Pittsburgh. Patti and I were both long-time leaders in BSF in the Raleigh area. We have tried to use that experience to contribute to positive missions in the Pittsburgh area.

As I am sure that many of you who served IBM in Boca have found, I frequently use the leadership and product management skills that I learned during my 35 years with IBM. For me, those skills were critical to my contributions to community organizations, such as the time that I served as VP of Membership with the Boy Scout council in the Raleigh area. I found that same critical importance to be true as I served in conference-level roles in our church while in NC and as Patti and I worked on missions in Pittsburgh. In the work environment, I found those skills to be fundamental to my ability to contribute to rapid growth in the new business around ZOLL's LifeVest product during my almost-10-year tenure with ZOLL.

For the last year, I have invested much of my evening and weekend time as the COO of a startup company based in Atlanta. Those same IBM skills have been the key to what we have done to-date to build that company. As a former IBM friend said to me during a time when we were faced with a very difficult challenge at ZOLL, "you and I are going to have to solve this." He reminded me that we were the only ones in the company that had "the DNA" to work through that particular extremely bad situation. We knew that we would find successful resolution.

The "DNA" that he referenced was an analogy for the "base skills and ability" that a long-IBM experience offers to those who seize the opportunity. I love to use the "Apollo 13 analogy" to describe

this point. (The absolute best IBM management development course that I ever took was based on the two management systems used during the Apollo 13 challenge. Those of you who are reading this might remember that course.) Gene Krantz (the NASA leader on the ground during Apollo 13) said it with these words, "Failure is not an option." From my perspective, those words, summarize the "DNA" that many of us gained during our IBM experiences.

For me, that IBM experience (of 35 years) was in 4 locations (Boca (where my date-of-hire was August 26, 1974), Atlanta (where I earned my Ph.D. in EE under the IBM Resident Study Program), Somers (where I served as AA to 2 senior IBM executives), and Raleigh). As I am sure that many of you experienced, I served in IBM with many stupendous individuals and leaders. Actually, some of you who are reading this are among those that I include on this personal list. My list includes individuals such as Jerry Merckel, Jud McCarthy, Pete Martinez, Manny Fotiadis, Gene Ciotoli, Mike Fascetti, Tom Winkles, Max Bouknecht, and many others.

I have contact every year (on my IBM service date of August 26) with Jerry Merckel. Every once and a while, I talk with others on this list. For me, my 35-year IBM experience (and my faith) formed the foundation for my entire life. I look forward to sometime moving back to South Florida (where that life journey was first shaped by IBM, after my first graduation from Georgia Tech).
